

AN ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION FOR A U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT (HUD) LEAD-BASED PAINT HAZARD REDUCTION CONTROL PROGRAM GRANT IN AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,000,000.00 FOR A THREE (3) YEAR PERIOD TO MEET THE APPLICATION PROCESS REQUIREMENTS; AND AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF THE HUD LEAD-BASED PAINT HAZARD REDUCTION CONTROL PROGRAM GRANT AWARD TO CONTINUE THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO'S LEAD-BASED PAINT HAZARD REDUCTION CONTROL PROGRAM TO OFFSET THE COST OF ADDRESSING THE LEAD ABATEMENT REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED ON RESIDENTIAL REHABILITATION PROJECTS, AND TO ASSIST WITH SCREENING HIGH-RISK YOUTH FOR ELEVATED LEAD LEVELS.

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WHEREAS, pursuant to a Notice of Funding Availability, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is accepting applications for the Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Control Program grant to continue the City's Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Program; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City to continue said program to offset the costs of addressing the lead abatement requirements imposed by HUD on residential rehabilitation projects where children ages six (6) years and under reside, and to assist with screening high-risk youth for elevated lead levels; and

WHEREAS, a grant in the amount of up to \$2,000,000.00 is awarded by HUD to municipalities competing for funding; and

WHEREAS, in order to complete the award process, HUD requires an in-kind match up to \$200,000.00 from the City, to be satisfied with in-kind funds provided through the City's Neighborhood Action Department's programmatic and administrative Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, and in-kind services provided from the San Antonio Metropolitan Health District; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to authorize such application, and authorize the acceptance of said grant, if awarded; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City's application for a U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Program Grant, for a grant amount of \$2,000,000.00

to continue the Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Program to offset the cost of addressing the lead abatement requirements imposed by HUD on residential rehabilitation projects where children ages six (6) years and under reside, and to assist with screening high-risk youth for elevated lead levels is hereby authorized. In connection therewith, the City Manager, or in her stead, either the Deputy City Manager, an Assistant City Manager, an Assistant to the City Manager, the Director of the Neighborhood Action Department or the Director of Housing and Community Development is hereby authorized to accept such HUD Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Program Grant on behalf of the City, if awarded, and to execute all related contracts and other documents in connection therewith.

SECTION 2. The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to designate a fund number for the Lead Based Paint Hazard Reduction Program for use in accounting for the above grant, if awarded, and the sum of \$3,065,331.58 is hereby authorized to be appropriated in said fund. The Director may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific Index Codes and Fund Numbers as necessary to carry out the purpose of this Ordinance.


SECTION 3. The in-kind funds and services provided through the City's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), the City's Neighborhood Action Department and the Metropolitan Health District, is hereby authorized.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall be effective on and after the 4th day of July, 2004.
