

AN ORDINANCE **101467**

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A CONTRACT WITH A & D TESTS, INC. IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$35,000.00 ANNUALLY IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR RANDOM DRUG TESTING AND DRUG TESTING BASED ON REASONABLE SUSPICION FOR THE SAN ANTONIO POLICE DEPARTMENT; AND PROVIDING FOR PAYMENT.

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Police Department is in need of random and reasonable suspicion drug testing services; and

WHEREAS, after the issuance of a request for proposals, the receipt of the proposals submitted in response, and an extensive evaluation of the proposals, A & D Tests, Inc. was selected to provide said services; and

WHEREAS, the annual cost that the City would incur during the term of the contract would not exceed \$35,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the term of contract will be for one year, from October 1, 2005, through September 30, 2006, with three one-year renewal options; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager, or his designated representative, is hereby authorized to execute a contract with A & D Tests, Inc. to provide random and reasonable suspicion drug testing services for the San Antonio Police Department. The term of said contract will be for one year, from October 1, 2005, through September 30, 2006, with three one-year renewal options. The annual cost of said contract shall not to exceed \$35,000.00. A copy of said contract is attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit I. The terms and conditions contained in said contract are hereby approved.

SECTION 2. Funds in an amount not to exceed \$35,000.00 are authorized to be encumbered in Cost Center 1701010006 (Drug Testing), General Ledger 5201040 (Fees to Professional

Contractors), Fund 11001000 (General Fund) and made payable to A & D Tests, Inc., when a purchase order is issued.


SECTION 3. The financial allocations in this ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance. The Director may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific cost centers, WBS elements, internal orders, general ledger accounts, and funds as necessary to carry out the purposes of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Upon the affirmative vote of at least eight members of the San Antonio City Council, this ordinance shall become effective immediately; otherwise, this ordinance shall become effective ten days from the date of passage.
