

AN ORDINANCE **100580**

AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A CONTRACT AND CERTAIN AMENDMENTS THERETO, WITH WASTE MANAGEMENT OF TEXAS, INCORPORATED (WMI) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$16,500.00 FOR THE WMI ANNUAL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM DURING THE PERIOD MARCH 24, 2005 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2005; AND AUTHORIZING THE ALLOCATION AND EXPENDITURE OF HUMAN DEVELOPMENT SERVICES FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,500.00 FROM COUNCIL DISTRICT 1, \$1,000.00 FROM COUNCIL DISTRICT 2, \$3,000.00 FROM COUNCIL DISTRICT 3, \$3,000.00 FROM COUNCIL DISTRICT 4, \$2,000.00 FROM COUNCIL DISTRICT 5, \$5,000.00 FROM COUNCIL DISTRICT 6 AND \$1,000.00 FROM COUNCIL DISTRICT 7 FOR A TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$16,500.00 FOR THE WMI ANNUAL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

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WHEREAS, the Fiscal Year (FY) 2005 Adopted Budget passed and approved through Ordinance No. 99725 on September 16, 2004 allocated funds for the Human Development Services Funds (HDSF) for each City Council District and the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 100192, passed and approved on December 16, 2004, authorized the municipal public purposes for HDSF expenditures, including those that promote the professional needs of the City and prepare the workforce for productive employment; and

WHEREAS, Waste Management of Texas, Incorporated (WMI), operates an Annual College Scholarship Program providing funding for Southside high school graduates to attend college who would not otherwise be able to afford college tuition; and

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2005, Councilman Barrera (Council District 6) circulated a memorandum requesting to place as a City Council agenda item the authorization to reallocate \$5,000.00 of the Council District 6 HDSF to WMI, in support of their annual College Scholarship Fund; and

WHEREAS, Councilman Barrera also requested the Mayor and each Councilmember to consider contributing HDSF to the WMI; and

WHEREAS, various Councilmembers desire to contribute HDSF totaling \$16,500.00 for the support of the WMI Annual College Scholarship Program; and

WHEREAS, the public purpose for said expenditure is to promote the professional needs of the City and prepare the workforce for productive employment; and

WHEREAS, post secondary education and job training are eligible projects under the workforce development initiatives of the HDSF; and

WHEREAS, the WMI College Scholarship Program will provide human development related services in the priority area of workforce development; **NOWTHEREFORE**:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The Interim City Manager, or his designee, or the Director of the Department of Community Initiatives is authorized to execute a contract with Waste Management of Texas, Incorporated (WMI) in the amount of \$16,500.00 for the WMI Annual Scholarship Program during the period March 24, 2005 through September 30, 2005. A copy of said contract is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as Attachment I.

SECTION 2. Funds in the amount of \$1,500.00 are authorized to be encumbered in Fund 11001000 entitled "General Fund", Cost Center 7004010001, General Ledger 5201040 entitled "Fees to Professional Contractors". These funds are authorized to be payable to Waste Management of Texas, Incorporated.

SECTION 3. Funds in the amount of \$1,000.00 are authorized to be encumbered in Fund 11001000 entitled "General Fund", Cost Center 7004020001, General Ledger 5201040 entitled "Fees to Professional Contractors". These funds are authorized to be payable to Waste Management of Texas, Incorporated.

SECTION 4. Funds in the amount of \$3,000.00 are authorized to be encumbered in Fund 11001000 entitled "General Fund", Cost Center 7004030001, General Ledger 5201040 entitled "Fees to Professional Contractors". These funds are authorized to be payable to Waste Management of Texas, Incorporated.

SECTION 5. Funds in the amount of \$3,000.00 are authorized to be encumbered in Fund 11001000 entitled "General Fund", Cost Center 7004040001, General Ledger 5201040 entitled "Fees to Professional Contractors". These funds are authorized to be payable to Waste Management of Texas, Incorporated.

SECTION 6. Funds in the amount of \$2,000.00 are authorized to be encumbered in Fund 11001000 entitled "General Fund", Cost Center 7004050001, General Ledger 5201040 entitled "Fees to Professional Contractors". These funds are authorized to be payable to Waste Management of Texas, Incorporated.

SECTION 7. Funds in the amount of \$5,000.00 are authorized to be encumbered in Fund 11001000 entitled "General Fund", Cost Center 7004060001, General Ledger 5201040 entitled "Fees to Professional Contractors". These funds are authorized to be payable to Waste Management of Texas, Incorporated.

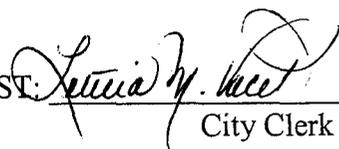
SECTION 8. Funds in the amount of \$1,000.00 are authorized to be encumbered in Fund 11001000 entitled "General Fund", Cost Center 7004070001, General Ledger 5201040 entitled "Fees to Professional Contractors". These funds are authorized to be payable to Waste Management of Texas, Incorporated.

SECTION 9. The Interim City Manager, or his designee, or the Director of the Department of Community Initiatives is authorized to execute contract amendments to the contract described in this ordinance when additional monies increase funding to said contract in an amount not exceeding twenty-five percent (25%) of the total contract or \$25,000.00, whichever is the lesser amount, provided the cumulative total of all amendments increasing contract funding during the term of the contract shall not exceed the foregoing amount.

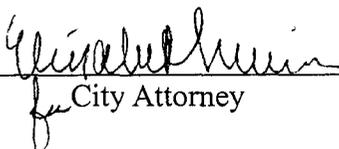
SECTION 10. The financial allocations in this ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director of Finance, subject to concurrence by the Interim City Manager, or the Interim City Manager's designee, may correct allocations to specific SAP Fund Numbers, SAP Project Definitions, SAP WBS Elements, SAP internal orders and SAP GL Accounts as necessary to carry out the purpose of this ordinance.

SECTION 11. This ordinance shall become effective on and after April 3, 2005.
