

AN ORDINANCE 9 8 8 6 8

ACCEPTING THE LOW RESPONSIVE BID SUBMITTED BY LAWRENCE MARSHALL FORD-MERCURY L.P. TO PROVIDE THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO POLICE, FIRE AND THE PARKS & RECREATION DEPARTMENTS WITH POLICE PATROL SEDANS FOR A TOTAL OF \$3,217,774.00.

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WHEREAS, bids were submitted to provide the City of San Antonio Police, Fire and Parks & Recreation Departments with police patrol sedans to be utilized for routine law enforcement and arson investigations; and

WHEREAS, the bids submitted by Philpott Motors Ltd. failed to meet the City specifications; and

WHEREAS, Lawrence Marshall Ford-Mercury L.P. was the low responsive bidder for a total contract cost of \$3,217,774.00; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The low, responsive bid of Lawrence Marshall Ford-Mercury L.P. to provide the City of San Police, Fire and Parks & Recreation Departments with police patrol sedans for a total amount of \$3,217,774.00 is hereby accepted, subject to and contingent upon the deposit of all required bonds, performance deposits and insurance certificates. All other bids will be considered rejected upon the deposit by the successful bidder of all required bonds, performance deposits and insurance certificates or the expiration of sixty days from the effective date hereof, whichever occurs first. The bid and bid tabulation sheet are attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as Attachment A.

SECTION 2. It has been found and declared that the low bid of Philpott Motors Ltd. failed to meet the City's specifications.

SECTION 3. Funds in the amount of \$3,217,774.00 are authorized to be encumbered in Fund 72-000000 (Equipment Renewal and Replacement Fund) in Index Code 241034 entitled "Sedans – Police, Fire" and made payable to Lawrence Marshall Ford-Mercury L.P.

SECTION 4. The financial allocations in this ordinance are subject to approval by the Director of Finance, City of San Antonio. The Director may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocation to specific index codes and fund numbers as necessary to carry out the purpose of this ordinance.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect on February 29, 2004.
