AN ORDINANCE **99498**

AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER OR HER DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE A COST REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT FOR UP TO \$175,000.00 WITH SAN ANTONIO FIGHTING BACK FOR OVERTIME COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH PUBLIC SAFETY ACTIVITIES INCURRED FROM OCTOBER 1, 2003, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2004, OF THE WEED AND SEED INITIATIVE.

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Weed and Seed Initiative works to combat and prevent violent crime in areas of San Antonio plagued by criminal activity; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice has awarded San Antonio Fighting Back \$175,000.00 in funds that may be used to support the San Antonio Weed and Seed Initiative for the period October 1, 2003, through September 30, 2004; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to enter into a cost reimbursement agreement with San Antonio Fighting Back for the expenditure of the aforementioned funds in connection with the public safety activities engaged in in connection with the San Antonio Weed and Seed Initiative; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager, or her designee, is hereby authorized to execute a cost reimbursement agreement, in substantially the same form as the agreement attached hereto, for up to \$175,000.00 with San Antonio Fighting Back for costs incurred by the San Antonio Police Department during the period October 1, 2003, through September 30, 2004, in connection with the San Antonio Weed and Seed Initiative. The executed agreement shall be maintained by the Office of the Chief of Police.

SECTION 2. Fund No. 26-012267 (Weed and Seed Law Enforcement Initiative) is hereby designated for use in accounting for the above project, and the sum of

\$175,000.00 is hereby appropriated in said fund as set out in the detailed budget affixed hereto.

SECTION 3. The Director of Finance, may, subject to concurrence by the City Manager, or her designee, allocate to specific index codes and fund numbers as necessary to carry out the purposes of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect ten days from the date of passage.




